

Tecumseh will be busy during the All-School Reunion July 1-3

The 2011 Tecumseh All-School Reunion scheduled for July 1-3 is fast approaching! Regina Doty, coordinator of the event, said she received reservations from 166 alumni who are planning to return for the reunion. Doty added there are 188 reservations for the Saturday evening meals.

Some of the 166 alumni planning to return for the reunion will be coming from Kansas, Florida, Oregon, Illinois, Maryland, Ohio, Wyoming, Arizona, Colorado, Missouri, Georgia, Utah, Virginia, Iowa, Idaho, California, Nevada, Minnesota, Vermont, Wisconsin, New Mexico, Oklahoma and Canada.

On Saturday, July 2, alumni must go to the high school gymnasium at Johnson County Central Schools in Tecumseh to register and pick up their tickets between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. The school facilities will be open for alumni to tour.

Doty encourages anyone who has special products the alumni might be interested in to promote these products in the gymnasium during the reservation hours. Doty said these promotions don't have to be school related.

Valley Schools will be held at the Johnson County Fairgrounds starting at 10 a.m. Items being sold include desks, chairs, athletic items, books, buses and vans and a lot of miscellaneous items.

At Ramsey Family Fountain, alumni can view a wonderful photo display of Johnson County veterans and other miscellaneous items that may be of interest. A John Deere Museum located north of the Johnson County Medical Center features a private collection of John Deere items by Dr. Keith Shuey. The museum chronicles the John Deere Company and rural America in general during the good and bad times.

Alumni are also invited to stop by and view the restoration process of the Cornerstone Building located on the corner of Third and Clay Streets. Two members of Tecumseh's Class of 1971, Jim Borrenpohl and Fred Pooch, initiated the preservation of this building.

The Johnson County Museum, located at the corner of Third and Lincoln Streets, will also be open on Saturday from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. and again on Sunday from 1 to 3 p.m.

The Saturday evening meal is scheduled for 6 p.m. A list of the

classes and meal locations will be published in a future edition of the *Tecumseh Chieftain* once final preparations are completed.

After the meals, a fenced in beer garden will be located on the west side of the square in front of Ramsey Family Fountain with music provided by Complete Music of Lincoln.

A demolition derby will be held at the Johnson County Fairgrounds, on Saturday evening starting at 6 p.m. There will be an admission fee. A dance featuring "Cowboy Up Band" will follow. The Johnson County Fair Board will sponsor the demolition derby.

On Sunday, July 3, the Tecumseh Civic Club will be serving a pancake and sausage breakfast at the Baptist Activity Center. A barbecue picnic will be served out of the Tecumseh Fire Hall by Scotty's Catering from 12 noon to 2 p.m.

M and M Supply, owned by Tim Morrissey of Tecumseh, will provide its annual fireworks display at dusk Sunday evening.

On Monday, July 4, the city of Tecumseh will sponsor a fireworks display at the Johnson County Fairgrounds.
